DAY 1:

Transfer to Caen from CDG Paris Airport, have lunch in a gourmet restaurant in the old pedestrian area of Caen and visit the memorial museum. Continue to Bayeux, and check in at the Chateau de la Cheneviere.

DAY 2:

After breakfast, take off for a full day tour of landing beaches including Omaha Beach, La Pointe-du-Hoc, Saint-Mere-Eglise, the American cemetery at Colleville, and also a lunch at restaurant La Trinquette in Grandcamp-Maisy.

DAY 3:

After breakfast, route to Falaise to evocate the last part of the battle of Normandy. Stop at the Museum august 1944 devoted to the "Falaise Pocket" and have lunch in a former shooting lodge. Then continue your excursion with a visit to the Montormel Memorial Museum that overlooks the corridor of death for the German.

DAY 4:

After breakfast, tour the Mont St Michel's abbey and discover this unique place "a rock lost in the sands." Have lunch at la Mère Poulard, and take some time at leisure to stroll through the medieval narrow streets and the ramparts of the island

DAY 5:

After breakfast, head off to the lovely fishing harbor of Honfleur, stop at a family cider farm, and have lunch at the old city of Honfleur. In the afternoon visit a few art Galleries and the famous wooden St Catherine church, then route to Chantilly for check in at the Chateau Mont Royal.

DAY 6:

After breakfast, enjoy your time at leisure before your flight back home.
